NOW undoubtedly Europe's largest and most successful fly-in - eclipsing the UK's former PFA rallies - the southern German town of Tannheim is home to the annual Tannkosh Fly-In (in tribute to the EAA and Oshkosh). This year's attendance was large with around 1,200 aircraft flying to the German grass field from every corner of Europe.

It is also an important trade venue for manufacturers of smaller general aviation aircraft. The show is a blend of modern and vintage; classics mix with warbirds such as the Corsair, T-6 and Stearman. The EADS modern built Me.262 jet also put in an appearance on the Friday to thrill the Tannkosh early birds.
